Police Chief:

- Be cautious of the road construction going on within the Village.
- Illinois State Police increasing traffic control for the next couple of weeks.

Superintendent:

- Morris Street contractor finishing up installation of storm sewers this week. Removing old rad and preparing subgrade base next week.
- Water Department has been lowering 6" water main and services. Boil orders in effect in these areas until tomorrow.
- Hollywood Heights Road water line improvements – All services are tied over to the new main and main is in service. Anticipating installation of pressure valve on new line just past hillside.
- Working on bid documents for all of Long Street asphalt overlay and all side streets from Long Street to 157 (CDBG grant project Fall 2021).
- Submitted CDBG grant to county for asphalt overlay on Morris Street starting at 2nd Street to 5th Street and Old Caseyville Road (\$100,000 grant 2022 project).
- Working on a fully funded grant for the Community Center and Village Hall. Building could potentially run off of full solar energy by next summer, eliminating electric bill with a \$30,000+ yearly savings.
- Farm ditches have been cleaned out (Parkdale, Botanical-Forest Blvd.)
- Cleaning out and flushing main ditch through town.
- New tornado sirens installed behind St. Stephen's church.
- Public Works will be installing new street signs and posts for the downtown business district within the next month or so as time allows.
- Phil and I meeting tomorrow for annual inspection and MS-4 Environmental Storm Water control.
- Contractor continues to update fire sprinkler system at Community Center and Village Hall. Estimated completion of 4 more weeks.
- Skate ramps at park are all repaired. Bathrooms in park opening 2nd week of April.
- Village Hall anticipating opening back up soon. Possibly as soon as the 1st week of April. Waiting for new plan release from governor.
- IDOT is scheduled to resurface Highway 157 from Petroff Drive in Caseyville to State Street in East St. Louis this summer.

Attorney Doug Stewart:

- We have a several demos tentatively scheduled.
- KFC will open April 6th.
