Planning/Zoning:

- Planning Committee approved, so please place on Agenda Zoning Change from AG (Agricultural) to I-1 (Industrial) Permanent Parcel 02-14.0-400-015 (I-64, East St. Louis, IL), 02-14.0-400-016 (I-64 East St. Louis, IL), 02-23.0-200-004 (N. 81st St., East St. Louis, IL) and 02-14.0-400-021 (1850 N. 81st St., East St. Louis, IL. (Case No. PC-001-2022)
- Planning Committee approved, so please place on Agenda to Vacate portion of Public Right-Of-Way on Tucker Drive for Tyson Food. (Case No. PC-002-2022)
- Planning Committee approved different verbiage, so please place on Agenda Request to Amend section 40-2-51 of Development Code, verbiage from Planning Commission regarding Front Yard Fences (Case No. PC-003-2022). Corner lots may have a 6' tall privacy fence extended from the rear corner of house to right-of-way.

Police:

- The department rotates vehicles every 8 to 9 years. Please place on Agenda to approve the purchase 2 2022 Tahoe's for the Police Department. Due to supply shortages these probably won't be available until 2023. Pricing is \$38,000-\$43,000 per vehicle. Will be using some Grant \$ as well. These would be ordered in March and don't expect to take delivery until later next year and the vehicles will be paid for when delivered.
- Kudos to the Police Department. Looking over the Chief's report from last meeting our Officers go above and beyond their duties. The Officers made 2079 Traffic Stops, 624 Citations were written, but 1817 Warnings were given. These Officers look at all things during the incident and just don't right tickets to be writing tickets and hitting quotas!

Public Works/Building:

- None

Special Events:

- Wingfest 5/21/2022 – all Park Pavilions have been reserved for this event. They have also been in touch with the VFW regarding water facilities.

Cemetery:

- Working on the Not-for-Profit status. They have done 2 burials, 7 plot locations and fixed 4 large headstones. Need to work on a source of revenue.
- Place on Agenda the Cemetery Association's rate increases for the opening and closing of graves and cremations.

- Is it possible to have a procedure in place to try and sell some of the empty lots owned by the Village? There is a possibility the High School maybe interested in a lot for a school project.
