Police Chief:

- The Fishing Derby was another great success, had 85 kids. A great time was had by all and thank goodness the weather held out. A big Thanks to Rob Crane for all his hard work, as well as the volunteers and all community sponsors. The 100 MPH club provided the food. VFW Auxiliary donated bikes. Lots of turtles were caught, had a 16" bass and a large snake (which did not get measured). Will do again next year.

Superintendent of Public Works:

- No report available.

Attorney Doug Stewart:

- With the abatements approved this evening, we will have 3 to 6 properties to demo by early July. Scates property, owner is still not available.
- The Mayor and I will be meeting with Unit 10 individuals, along with Collinsville and Maryville, as they are trying to establish a joint Economic Development purpose. This would include a joint Marketing effort to attract jobs, which in turn would attract more residents. Obviously, we are different markets, Collinsville and Maryville are more retail, whereas Caseyville is more industrial. Unit 10 School would assist in providing job training for students and younger adults.
- Meeting with the Corp of Engineers regarding the Levee. They are still interested in working with the Village based on our studies and being ahead of the situation/program. Meeting with the Head of Regional Corp and delegates from our Federal Offices, including Senator Duckworth, Senator Durbin, Congresswoman Budzinski along with some of their staff. Some monies have been designated to the Department of Natural Resources to do some additional studies (more regionally focused). Additional budget conversations are happening.
- Liquor License Ordinance will be discussed in committee (draft was provided to the Board members).
