Cemetery:

- Started doing some research, started with the Illinois State Historical Preservation Office, who then in turn sent me to Illinois Department of Financial Professionals Regulations, I talked with a Denise Bullock, who in turn then introduced me to Shawn Stevens, IDFP Cemetery Oversight Investigator from Springfield, IL. We had a meeting yesterday with Shawn, Tammy, Tamara, the Mayor, Dick and me. Shawn advised that the association requires a license to run the cemetery. It also must be registered with the Comptroller for the State of Illinois. Apparently in 2013 there was an oversight regarding a Grant and that money was returned to Chicago. Shawn advised that maybe in 2025 or 2026 Grant money will be available. Historical is only a word, the only way to become an Historical Cemetery is if someone very important is buried there or an historical event took place. Unless the cemetery is over 100 years old, then it can be considered historical. Doug will you please provide the documents you mentioned at the last meeting you had prepared and ready to present to the Association. Deb Doughty advised that a cemetery in Maryville tried to start the process, but advised it was too complex, so they stopped. It's needs to be either an Historical Cemetery or an Historical landmark, these are 2 different options. Hopefully we can go further into researching this Historical opportunity.
